General Service Article

Summer Assembly

On Saturday, August 8, the California Northern Coastal Area (Area 06) held its annual summer assembly in Fortuna (Humboldt County). Three hundred sixty four recovered alcoholics attended this assembly.

Of the 4 assemblies the area hosts each year, the summer assembly is considered the "fun" assembly, as very little formal business is conducted. Following a business meeting (at which area officers and the chairs of standing committees present reports) and lunch, the "fun" aspect of a summer assembly begins with a series of workshops on various AA-related topics. Here is a list of topics from the summer assembly.

- Practicing AA's principles the pathway to unity
- Dogma in AA
- Outreach to young people in AA
- Anonymity in the age of electronic media and social networking
- PIC CPC attraction vs promotion
- GSR leader at the home group, district and area

Each workshop consisted of a 10 to 15 minute presentation on one of the above topics, followed by an hour-long session during which attendees expressed their thoughts on each topic. I attended the Dogma and Anonymity workshops.

At the Dogma workshop the presenter (Todd S. of District 70, Alameda South) offered two definitions of dogma: "a doctrine or a code of beliefs accepted as authoritative" and "a doctrine proclaimed as true without basis in truth." He went on to offer a few examples of dogma in AA:

- "if you take psych medications, you aren't sober," vs the Big Book description of the world being "abundantly supplied" with "fine doctors, psychologists, and practitioners of various kinds," (p.133)
- "Work the steps or dies," vs the Big Book characterization of the steps as being "suggested as a program of recovery" (pg59).
- "Ninety meetings in ninety days." This practice arose in treatment facilities
- Chanting
- "Men sponsor men; women sponsor women." Todd asked, "who sponsored the first woman in AA and how does this work in gay/lesbian/bisexual/transgender contexts?"
- "Don't get into a relationship in the first year of sobriety."

These "dogmas" triggered a wide-ranging, insightful, and extraordinarily tolerant series of comments.

At the Anonymity workshop, the presenter (Janet B.) mentioned the AA guidelines for the Internet. These are available from www.aa.org by searching the site for "internet." This document has a wealth of information for groups and individual members as they consider the implications of social-networking sites, email, website creation, and other manifestations of the online world. Janet also quoted the Tradition 11 essay: "...personal ambition has no place in AA." She said, "Anonymity is all about the newcomer experiencing an atmosphere of trust and openness." She quoted the AA Internet guideline: "social networking web sites are public in nature...As long as individuals do not identify themselves as AA members, there is no conflict of interest."

Janet called GSO to ask about the increasing number of anonymity breaks that occur on the Internet (mostly, she emphasized, by people who are just trying to be helpful to others). The Public Information contact at GSO commented that almost the entire job is spent dealing with Facebook and MySpace issues. When anonymity breaks come to GSO's attention, GSO tries to track the person who broke his or her anonymity and then asks that person's area delegate to speak gently to the person about the spiritual considerations of Tradition 11.

Janet closed by mentioning a passage on Tradition 11 from *Dr. Bob and the Good Oldtimers* (pg 264), which describes Dr. Bob's position on the tradition: "Since our tradition on anonymity designates the exact level where the line should be held, it must be obvious to everyone who can read and understand the English language that to maintain anonymity at any other level is definitely a violation of this tradition."

ARCHIVES CORNER

"Three men sat around the bed of an alcoholic patient in the psychopathic ward of Philadephia General Hospital one afternoon. The man in the bed, who was a complete stranger to them, had the drawn and slightly stupid look that inebriates get while being defogged after a bender. They were members of Alcoholics Anonymous, a band of ex-problem drinkers who make an avocation of helping other alcoholics to beat the liquor habit." (from March 1, 1941 issue of The Saturday Evening Post by Jack Alexander.)

Now consider this:

In the Archives of Santa Clara County is a letter dated June 30, 1941, to the American Medical Association from Allen C., asking how he and a few of his friends could get help to stop drinking. A letter on July 9, 1941 was written to Allen C. from the A.M.A. advising him to write the Saturday Evening Post, since the magazine published an article "dealing with it". A letter dated July 17, 1941 to Alcoholics Anonymous from the Saturday Evening Post states "We have been asked by Mr. A. C. to send you the enclosed letter". Finally, a letter from Ruth Hock, Bill's first secretary, reached Allen in the middle of July advising him that there is an A.A. fellowship at Box 4492 in San Francisco, also sending his inquiry to John C., then Secretary of that Group. Jim was given the inquiry and he and his wife, Alice, contacted Al and took him to his first meeting in Oakland on July 28th. 1941. The first formal meeting in San Jose was in a downtown office building on Wednesday evening, August 6th, 1941 with Al C. attending. Allen made a big effort to find us and was eventually one of the early founders of our local groups. We owe much to our early members who worked hard to start A.A. in Santa Clara County.


