

Anonymity, A Thread that Weaves its Way throughout our Steps and Traditions

AA has taught me to turn to the steps and traditions whenever I encounter problems in life. What that looks like in a practical sense is to pick up ‘the tools’ of this Program. Tools that include calling my sponsor, reaching out to trusted friends (the trusted part has been somewhat elusive), picking up the Big Book, working with newcomers, getting to a meeting, connecting with my higher power, reading our literature, etc.

In picking up either the Big Book or the ‘12 & 12’, I’ve found many references to anonymity throughout almost every step and every tradition. Tradition twelve begins with “*Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions,*” so that tells me it’s the basis for every single one. You could say that anonymity is the cornerstone of AA. I believe that anonymity is very likely our most important principle, concept and action. Without anonymity, and its underlying humility, our easily inflated egos can wreak havoc on everyone around us; both inside and outside of our Program.

Love and Service are the ‘official’ principles behind step twelve, but I think that humility, courage, honesty, hope and faith are all there as well. Whenever I’m in my head or in my problems, selfishness and self-centeredness, with fear at the core, are always what is driving me. Yet when I’m entrenched in step twelve or tradition twelve, actually practicing the humility behind anonymity and service, I’m the one who benefits.

Even going back to the name ‘Alcoholics Anonymous’, I’m reminded that Bill was given its origin by a guy who was a resident of Bellevue hospital. The guy sat near Bill in an early meeting and kept repeating to himself “...anonymous alcoholics, anonymous alcoholics, anonymous alcoholics...” After that meeting Bill and the first members swapped the

order of the two words, and they had the name of our program. It seems pretty fitting that a crazy guy from Bellevue hospital was responsible for our programs name. As the groups and the program grew, so did issues with anonymity. Early members asked – Should our stories be told outside of AA? Should they be told by people other than ourselves? Would newcomers still want to join us if we shared their names? What about members who fell off the wagon? At what level should we protect our anonymity? Weren’t anonymity and publicity on different ends of the spectrum? All of these are valid questions, some which AA has answered and some which remain unanswered.

Even understanding that this works, I still can get so caught up in my problems that I forget the tools I’ve been so freely given here in AA. Time after time this program of action gets me out of me, but only if I stay in the steps and practice the traditions. Boiled down to their essence of love, service and sacrifice they are what are behind all the traditions, but especially behind tradition twelve. So its anonymity, practicing true humility, which is what will save me in my darkest moments. I have a phone reminder that pops up weekly with the message that I’m ‘humility challenged’. I also have a good friend who shared the following question and the suggestion that I learn to use it as regularly. That question is “I don’t know...what would you do?”

Tradition twelve in the 12 & 12 ends with “*We are sure that humility, expressed by anonymity, is the greatest safeguard that Alcoholics Anonymous could ever have.*”

If anonymity is our safeguard, shouldn’t we go to any lengths to protect both our own anonymity and the anonymity of our fellow members?

A Joyful Time of year Bringing Joy to the Less Fortunate

How appropriate it seems that there are twelve months in a year and we have twelve steps in the program. The joy of good living is the theme of the twelfth step and it blends right in with the holiday season in November and December, starting with Thanksgiving and ending with the New Years Eve celebration. This time of year does bring a lot of joy to many of us but it also brings distress to some of the less fortunate ones who haven't yet been blessed with the gift of sobriety and peace of mind in and outside of A.A.

During my drinking days, I used to be very uncomfortable about the holidays. I never knew how to act around normal people unless I was half smashed. When invited to a celebration, I felt like a charity case and would rather just hang out at the bar where I felt safe. I never got into the spirit of reaching out to others. My family always celebrated the different holidays, and I always (due to My discomfort) would put a damper on it by complaining about the tacky gifts that people would buy for each other and the mad rush to go shopping and the commercializing facade that it had become. Any excuse was better than facing me and the miserable wretch I had become.

After being sober for several years, it occurred to me that I still had some of those same attitudes and that I was still holding on to them to some degree largely due to the inconvenience of it all. I explained this problem to a dear friend

once, and he asked, "Does the rest of the family enjoy the holidays?" I said yes. He then said, "Why don't you just take a back seat and just watch the joy in their eyes as they experience these things." I did exactly what he suggested and when I started to observe the childlike innocence and happiness it brought to them, it gave me a whole new appreciation for this time of year. It brought tears of Joy to my eyes and I no longer wanted to be the grouch, putting a damper on the joy that they were having. I have been following this line of thinking ever since and it has changed my whole attitude concerning these things.

This change of attitude has inspired me to apply the unselfish lessons that I've come to understand and now I spend the holiday season filled with joy. If it works like that for the holidays, then why can't I bring it with me for the rest of the year? This has been my mission for several years, and I am always looking for the opportunity to brighten the lives of people less fortunate than myself. I try to do these things anonymously and without fanfare. I also try to consider the discomfort that I used to feel when I was the one on the receiving end of a charitable gesture. I am very careful to do these things in a way that preserves the dignity of that other person. I don't have to wait for the holidays to do these things. Every day is a holiday in and outside of my home, and you can believe me when I say; I reap more than my share of the joy.

To Me

"Do not be discouraged, no one among us has been able to maintain anything like perfect adherence to these principles" are some lifesaving words for me that helped me keep on keeping on no matter what. I never thought I would ever "get it" like the other successful alcoholics at the meetings, had, it seemed, gotten it.

I had spiritual experiences, as discussed in the 12 x 12 and throughout the Steps 1 through 9 process. It made me feel sooo awesome and loved and aware of just how "the process" was changing me personally... changing my life. As I practiced the Step 10 daily inventory, and learning a life lesson the hard way of restraint of pen and tongue, it was time for Step 11. It taught me "thy will be done...not mine." I balked at and argued about it all the time with one of my best AA girlfriends because I was seeing and hearing it through a different pair of glasses. I thought I had a different slant on Step 11, but came to realize I really didn't. Coming to understand I didn't need to be a rocket scientist to get that God's will is God's will no matter what the platform of learning it is! I thought the wording meant something different, but in the end, it didn't and voila! Once I "got it," I had my profound Spiritual Awakening. The memory is touching me as I type this.

The Big Book equals a plan for living. The 12 Steps changed my life through a sponsor. I was taught how to trust God, clean house, make amends, and work with other women in the selflessness of the altruism of the program. The traditions gave me clarity

on the "whys & wherefores" of our program. Practicing the Principles in all my affairs - there is one for each Step. A psychic change, a transformation of thinking enabling me to embrace change, believing in the impossible, always celebrating the me of today. The me GOD always wanted me to be my entire life and continues growing me and will continue to do so forever (one day at a time).

A passion for life, compassion for others, attained by self-forgiveness, actually putting my name first on my 8th Step list, after my sponsor told me that if I didn't forgive myself I would be placing myself above God, because HE already had. Honesty, the truth shall set us free, love, joy, peace of mind, hope. All this stuff and much, much more is ours. Anyone can have it. Just being able to be here for anyone, anytime inside AA or out, for whatever reason, I am responsible. I am giving "it" away to keep it. I Let the Process take my mind, letting it be a part of me forever and Just One Day At A Time, A Spiritual Awakening became mine.

After I had my first spiritual experience (holy co-incidence my sponsor called it) I realized something very powerful had started happening. I was to find a something that I never guessed would be mine. That something was my Spiritual Awakening. This awakening entails so much more than I have written here, but you all get my drift. I just accepted the process and the process accepted me and is using me, and I'm so grateful to be being used!

Thy Will Be Done...not mine.

- We are still looking for more volunteers. To make this service more accessible to member I offer my service to come meet member to orientate them. I can be contacted by phone and time can be arranged. Six months of sobriety is required. Thank you and I hope we can get some new volunteers.

Day Time Office – n/a

Nights and Weekends Diverter Coordinator – Louie R.

- I will be stepping down as your Diverter Coordinator and Carol B. has graciously agreed to assume this role. Details will be worked out over the next couple of months and hopefully we will have this transition by the new year.

- Currently, we have only three shifts available. Two of them are on a Sunday from 6 am to 9 am. They are the fourth Sunday and fifth Sunday. Anytime you have a “fifth day” of any month, it occurs only once every 3 months, so if you are looking for a “real” easy service position, consider that one. Also, we have a Monday shift, again a fifth Monday, and that one is 4:30 pm to 7:00 pm.
- The Diverter Workshop will be held at its monthly scheduled time of the 3rd Saturday, which this month is November 17th, at 10:00am, at the Intergroup Central Office. No appointment needed, just show up. Sobriety requirement for the Diverter is 1 year and a working knowledge of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions.
- Please encourage your groups to attend Service Workshops, regardless of their current service interests. It enhances their horizons and helps them understand all the things that Intergroup does for A.A. and the alcoholic that is still suffering.
- Please encourage your groups that Diverter shifts are only once a month, and average about 3-4 hours a shift. And it is a great way to make a big difference.

 - 5th Monday – 4:30 pm to 7 pm

Secretary Workshop – Kathy R.

Old/Ongoing Business

- Non-AA approved literature in AA groups
- Laura T. raised a concern from the Newcomers, Oldtimers Women's Sat 6pm group expressing concern that the Women's Step Topics Thursday 7pm group was not using AA-approved literature. The Saturday group is recommending that based on using non-AA approved literature that the Thursday group's listing be removed from the meeting guide. The group discussed the pros and cons of removing the group.
 - Tamlyn referred to General Service literature
- F29 Conference Approval Literature. "Not disapprove of other..."
- Big Book Sponsorship.org
- "yes" it is okay to read non-AA literature, unless your group decides only to read AA-approved literature.
- Little Red Book. In 1950, Bill wrote that AA has a place for introduction. Not policemen. AAs are free to do as they will.
 - Nan spoke as the Intergroup representative from the Women's Step Topics Thursday 7pm group. Though the group is using non-AA approved literature, the book being used is so useful. She has been going several months to Women's Step Topics, read and discuss topics. About 20 women have been attending.
 - Laura reported that no other traditional AA literature is used.
 - Tamlyn stated that a meeting exists when any two AAs are gathered together.
 - Laura – definition of group versus meeting? Several meetings (multiple meetings) form a group.
 - Michael J – look at the traditions. Any two gathered together...
- Tradition 3 – no other affiliation.
- In the 12 by 12, page 174, third paragraph
- Tradition 9 – group/proximate conformity to AA principles, else will die...
- Spiritual principles.
- The group will leave or die on its own.
- He recommends to just let the group go and it will either get closer to AA principles or will implode.
- Avoid punitive action since it may prolong the ultimate fate.
 - Laura – how is removal from the meeting listing punitive?
 - Amy – how does it affect the newcomer and alcoholics?
 - Amy made a motion to "Remove the group from the AA meeting directory."
 - Laura – seconded the motion.
 - Frances directed Intergroup representatives to take the motion back to your groups and we will vote on the motion next month.

New Business – none**North County General Service – Jacob S.**

- We had our election's last month. We have filled most office positions. This month we will elect the rest. Area 06 had its election assembly, last Saturday and all is well.

South County General Service - Nicolas G.

- Elections held last month. Scott, our General Service visitor tonight, is the new Chair.

Hospitals & Institutions – Joe B.

- Concerned about the low attendance by H&I representatives from each meeting. Joe recommends that the Intergroup representatives identify who is the H&I rep in their meetings and get them to attend the H&I monthly meetings every 4th Tuesday at 7pm at Leigh & Hamilton.
- H&I does work. Joe met someone who he had met in a jail H&I meeting who is now a family person who had completed college. Another person who he met in a psych lock down facilities who at that stage did not have a high school degree, now possesses a GED, an undergraduate degree, and a master's degree. And they are younger than he and retired!!
- Always looking for volunteers, they especially need help in Elmwood, Main, and Spanish speaking members. Also, to go into jails, you cannot have felonies on your record, no matter what/how long ago.

- Elections held last month and Paula is the new Chair. Still need a secretary at Pathways.
- Bridging the Gap 7pm the 3rd Monday on Hamilton & Leigh, needs volunteers and committee members.

PI/CPC – Louisa

- Nothing scheduled in November, but working on improving relations at a Juvenile Detention Center. The H&I rep there is having trouble getting the youths to attend meetings. The strategy is to speak with the correctional officers to get them to encourage participation of the youth. Want to extend outreach into high schools and junior highs. We are continuing our once a monthly Public Information Table at Bascom Library but seek another volunteer to have a table twice a month.

Meetings ignore the traditions as they would, the result may be not surviving. We should think about what traditions are being ignored. An example occurred in Edmonton where a group of atheists were blocked, and not listed in meeting guide. The atheist group sued AA and General Service in New York. Resolved by principle, meeting can do as it pleases, where does it say a deity has to be believed?
- Julie reminded us to look at the COIN (which can also be found online at asaanjo-se.org). In the middle of the COIN are calendars where all service meeting details can be found with times and addresses. Also you can find it in the Meeting Guide, and on line and by phone!


