

## August Meeting of the Month - Living Solutions Group

This started out as a meeting for both AAs and Al-Anons to talk, so they tango to the same meeting and have coffee afterwards with each other. A group met in August 1988 at Alano Club West and found Transfiguration Church as their first meeting site. The group requested to be registered in the directory but found resistance from Intergroup the first time around. They went back to Intergroup stating “as an open meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous anyone could share as long as the group conscience decided on that, which it did.” The meeting was then approved.

The meeting began with 50 in attendance and has fluctuated up and down over the years. Its ground rules are based in AA:

1. The format follows AA style, with only members of AA holding office, chairing the meeting or reading from the literature.
2. Al-Anons can share their experience, strength and hope from an Al-Anon perspective.

3. New secretaries are elected by the steering committee.

An excerpt from Chapter 8 of the Big Book (Letter to the Wives) is read each week. “If you and your partner find a solution for the pressing problem of drink you are, of course, going to be very happy. But all problems will not be solved at once... You, as well as your partner, ought to think of what you can put into life instead of how much you can takeout. inevitably your lives will befallen for doing so. You will lose the old life to find one much better.”

The meeting became known as the Couples Meeting, even though issues were not limited to couples and all singles are warmly invited to attend; hearing different viewpoints from each spouse has its strengths.

This meeting met at Transfiguration Church for many years, and moved to the Masonic Center, 2500 Masonic Drive in August 2015. It meets on Friday nights at 8:00 p.m. Pleased to let you know this is a child friendly meeting. See you there!

## Brotherly Love

The concept of Brotherly Love and the tradition stating “Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever non professional but our service centers may employ special workers.” holds a very different meaning for me today than it did before I came to Elmwood. I consider myself an incredibly blessed and fortunate member of AA. I am so grateful I had the opportunity to get sober, work the steps and take others through the steps before I came here. I am also so very grateful I have had the opportunity to take men through the steps here.

I have found that what Tradition eight says on page 166 second paragraph to be true, “Alcoholics simply will not listen to paid 12<sup>th</sup> steppers...” H&I comes in to our dorm one to two times per month. I am personally grateful I get to see friends and about eight guys attend those meetings. They mostly go to get out of the dorm and get a slip signed. It is a nice hour break from the dorm. The sharing, if any, is lackluster at best and we all leave planning to return to the next meeting.

In our dorm we have now had a 12x12 meeting running Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 9 am to 10 am. It is regularly attended by 10 to 12 guys. We share deeply, passionately, and authentically. It is common for these guys (gangsters or guys with violent pasts) to share from their hearts. Weekly someone, would never show fear or tears in public, will let them out in the meeting. Some guys consistently relapse (some of them weekly) but they keep coming back and we continue to welcome them back.

So why the difference? Does it have anything to do with the incredibly giving men of H&I? NO. My hat goes off to all those who are now or who have in the past done H&I work. I, as someone who personally knows many of you, am very, very grateful for all you do. I know how ardu-

ous of a process it is to deal with Elmwood and the main jail. In one alcoholic’s opinion who is here in this system, it comes down to relatability. It comes down to something or someone who can’t truly relate to where we are, compared to those who are all in the same life raft. It doesn’t matter that some of the guys in our meeting are homeless on the outside and others of us came from lives of privilege.

What further touches my heart about our meeting is the education that it also brings. Two of the regular attendees are 26 and 28 and read at a five year old level. All of us have been able to participate in helping them improve their reading. Watching these two men grow in their reading and grow in their self confidence and self love is touching. It’s an unexpected blessing of one alcoholic working with another alcoholic. Alcoholics Anonymous, but really good men and women have shown me that service is not just 12-step work.

In my opinion, education definitely for this population is just as important. Many of the guys here are above 3- and don’t have a high school diploma. They have seen abuse and violence that would make your skin crawl and they don’t see a way out. I’ve had a profound opportunity to work with multiple guys both as their sponsor and as their tutor. Watching a man who previously couldn’t read becoming able to read and write brings tears to my eyes. Watching the light go on in a man’s eyes when he realized he is not stupid; that he does not have to live as he has lived. When he realizes that maybe, just maybe there is more to live. Seeing and experiencing that has been one of the most rewarding things I have ever experienced.

Thank you AA for the concept of Brotherly Love and one alcoholic help another. Thank you all for your love and support.

## Rationalization—The Language of the Ego

As I grow older in the program I continue to question how all of the words I read and hear in the Big Book, The Twelve and Twelve and in the meetings that I attend and I see negative behaviors that weren't that obvious to me for a very long time. I understand that it takes time to process the simplest of our objectives in the beginning and as new shortcomings keep popping up we deal with them as we continue to grow, and it has become clear to me that I will never consider myself finished with this process until I consider myself perfect. (Yea right) They say that selfishness and self-centeredness that we think was the root cause of our problems, but why did we have those symptoms? That was the question that eventually caused me to look deeper since it became obvious to me that I still displayed those conducts after years of sobriety and didn't seem to bother me that much (at the time).

Rationalizing is a word that doesn't get much airtime in the meetings I attend, and I don't like to share something that would appear to be calling out someone else when they share. I try to confine my comments to my observations of my own behavior. Rationalization, as I understand it, means: Making a socially acceptable excuse for a socially unacceptable action, such as: I don't put my shopping cart back in the rack because they hired a person to do that and I don't want him/her to lose their job (Yea right). Being critical of other members of the program seemed to be acceptable in my early days of sobriety when talking with other members who, like me, were insecure and needed to prop themselves up. It was Constructive Criticism (Yea right).

My life before Alcoholics Anonymous was full of that type of reasoning and it was commonplace in my circle of friends. After being divorced from my first wife for about

two years, I told my current wife of forty eight years that I was going to stop bad-mouthing my first wife and that she was not my problem, that I was my problem and I didn't want to be her problem and I have kept that promise to this day. Divorce leaves, in its wake, Anger, Humiliation, Economic fear and a perfect Rationalization to point out the faults of the other and it could go on forever.

After ten years of keeping that promise, I started sharing, in meetings, what I had promised and I had another earth changing revelation when it occurred and I shared that: IF I could brag about never saying anything bad about my first wife and can still be gossiping and critical about other people, wouldn't that make me a hypocrite? That statement has been the biggest influence in my later term development. For the last fifteen years, or so, I have stopped being judgmental about anyone based on their outside behavior as they are all symptoms of the deeper-rooted emotional problems of alcoholism. This mindset is my way of Cutting off My Own Escape when it comes to those other people. All my motives today are of compassion and empathy and I become their biggest advocate.

To add a little levity to this subject at a meeting I describe it as follows: My criticism of another alcoholic's behavior would be like two patients in a convalescent home hitting each other with their canes because one wasn't walking fast enough for the other. Silly but true. I can care for and wish for the best for every human being I know even when they don't have the capacity to return the sentiment. As I look back at the habit of rationalizing, I refer to it as The Language of My Ego and over the years, I've learned a new Dialect and I refer to it as, The Language of My Conscience and it leaves no damage in its wake.

- The 33<sup>rd</sup> annual Old Timers meeting will be August 31<sup>st</sup> from 1 to 3 pm at the Lincoln Glen Church. It is an amazing, fast-paced meeting which is entertaining and moving. **Nights and Weekends Diverter Coordinator** – Carol B.

- Good evening – I am the Diverter Coordinator. Diverter Volunteers provide after-hours phone coverage for AA in Santa Clara County. When our Central Office is closed, incoming calls are diverted to a person who is on call. Diverter volunteers provide after-hours phone coverage from 4:30 pm-9:00 am Monday through Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday. Since tomorrow is a holiday, Diverter volunteers will cover the phones for 24 hours; the Thursday coordinator, Peter C., set up this coverage. The Diverter sobriety requirement is one year; the service term is at least one year but many serve longer. Each Diverter volunteer goes through a training workshop before assuming a Diverter shift. The workshop is held the third Saturday of each month (this month it's July 20), 10:00 am at Central Office. In addition to the sobriety requirement it is also important that the diverter have a working knowledge of the 12 steps and the 12 traditions.
- In the past month, we had six shifts open. All six of the shifts have been filled—three by people who agreed to become diverters for the first time.
- All DIVERTER shifts are currently filled.

Please encourage your group members to attend the diverter workshop to understand how this service helps the alcoholic who still suffers and note that diverters can take their shift wherever they happen to be: at home, at a meeting, at dinner, or out of town. This is an easy way to help another alcoholic, whether it's a newcomer or a person with long sobriety who is struggling.


