A FAMILY CELEBRATES 100 YEARS OF SOBRIETY

On October 27, 2023 a celebration was held for the Easthouse brothers (Vern and Gary) who celebrated 100 combined years of sobriety at the Living Solutions meeting. This meeting was founded by their father Al in the 1980's.

The standing room only crowd enjoyed a potluck feast and fellowship to honor this once in a lifetime occasion. The Living Solutions AA meeting followed at 7pm where we learned about the legacy of the Easthouse family in our flourishing AA community. The topic of the meeting was "Keep Coming Back".

Al Easthouse got sober July 22, 1951. On October 30, 1951 he attended the presentation of the Lasker Award to the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous for Distinguished Service in the Field of Public Health. It gave formal recognition of AA's success in treating alcoholism as an illness and in blotting out its social stigma.

Al met and shook hands with our founder Bill Wilson who was at the ceremony in San Francisco to accept the award. There is a photo of them taken at the event.

Interested in finding out about other family sobriety legacies, Gary wrote the following to the Grapevine in August 2023 (shared with permission).

"We live in the sober rich environment of 'quality sobriety' in Silicon Valley. There are over 700 AA meetings weekly in Santa Clara County.

My brother Vern and I got sober in the 1970's. Vern's sobriety date is 10/02/70 and mine is 10/12/76 we have 100 years of sobriety between us.

We've spoken with Archives at GSO in New York as well as members of the huge Pacific Group in Southern California and I have not found brothers with 100 years. I'm told Clancy has 3 daughters with 100 years which is impressive.

Our father Al Easthouse passed away 7/27/13 with 62 years. We are fortunate to have 10 members of our extended family in Alcoholics Anonymous.

We are curious to know if any brother combination in the US has 100 years.

In gratitude, knowing that 'GOD'S IN CHARGE'."

I felt so ashamed


Often sitting wondering
